Food Services for Strathmore Dormitory Students

Date: May 3, 2019

Description: Addendum 1 for The Provision of Food Services for Strathmore Dormitory Students

Details of Addendum:

This addendum is being issued to clarify information and answer questions received to-date.

1. On the first page of the call for proposals, under Proposal Information, there is an invitation to contact Geoff Ball for “a complete list of Proposal Information, including mandatory requirements.” To clarify, this information, including mandatory requirements, was already included as a part of the call (on pages 2–3), subject to the additions and clarifications in the remainder of this addendum.
2. In addition to what was originally identified, cleaning is to include food and drink displays, dishwashers, serving counters, deep fryers, mixers, steam tables, drink fountains, and drink machines in the cafeteria and kitchen, if applicable.
3. The mandatory site tour is expected to take between 30 and 45 minutes. Questions will be documented and answers will be provided to all participants.
4. Bids will only be accepted from individuals or firms who participate in a mandatory site visit.
5. The current cultural makeup of the Strathmore dormitory is 70% Korean, Japanese, and Hong Kong. Other countries represented include Mexico, Thailand, Taiwan, Burkina, Germany, India, China, Kenya, and Nigeria. In 2019-2020, the projection is for 17 countries to be represented in similar ratios.
6. Golden Hills will expect the successful applicant to perform regular upkeep and cleaning of the appliances, work surfaces, and storage areas in the kitchen. Repairs on those items would be the responsibility of Golden Hills (either in-house or by hired contractor), providing that maintenance was demonstrated to be performed regularly and nothing was ignored or permitted to fall into disrepair.
7. Pest control is the responsibility of Golden Hills.
8. For clarity, the selected provider of food services for the Strathmore dormitory is not responsible for lunches, as the students eat at their respective schools. The anticipated meal breakdown at the Strathmore dormitory is:
 - Breakfast and dinner, plus one snack, on school days
 - Brunch and dinner, plus one snack, on non-school days

9. The food service provider will not be expected to collect any money from students. The firm or individual would invoice Golden Hills on a set basis, to be determined (whether monthly, semi-monthly, or bi-weekly) and would be paid by Golden Hills directly.
10. Rent is expected to be paid monthly.
11. The successful firm will be selected by Golden Hills based on the following matrix:
 - a. Fee proposal (maximum of 50 points awarded)
 - Cost per student
 - Bagged lunch cost for ad hoc requests
 - Monthly rent
 - b. Experience and Qualifications (maximum of 30 points awarded)
 - References
 - Business/Mission Statement regarding customer service for students
 - Quality Assurance Program, including resumes and/or qualifications for staff
 - Years in service
 - School, cafeteria, or commercial experience
 - Cleaning schedules
 - c. Menu plan (maximum of 20 points awarded)
 - Adherence to *Canada's Food Guide*
 - Demonstration of variety (including vegetarian options) and cultural diversity in menu options
