

COVID-19 ALBERTA HEALTH DAILY CHECKLIST

Overview

This screening tool is developed to help reduce the risk of transmission of Covid-19 amongst staff and students in our schools. All staff, students and visitors are expected to use this tool prior to attending school. This checklist should be completed as part of a daily routine and younger children may need parental help to complete this screening tool.

If an individual answers **YES** to any of the questions, they **must not** be allowed to attend school.

***** Individuals with any of the top 5 symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath, runny nose, or sore throat), are now **required to isolate for 10 days**. They may return to school sooner only if they have a negative Covid test and are feeling better.

If an individual experiences other symptoms on the list, they should stay home. They may return to school when they feel better. A covid-19 test is also recommended.

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to evolve, this screening tool will be updated as required.

¹ Individuals legally required to quarantine for 14 days when entering or returning to Alberta from outside Canada

² Face-to-face contact within 2 metres. A health care worker in an occupational setting wearing recommended personal protective equipment is not considered to be a close contact.
