STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Background

Student achievement is affected by attendance. The Division, therefore, encourages regular attendance by students in order to maximize their educational opportunities.

Procedures

- 1. Each school shall develop written procedures that will encourage school attendance.
- 2. The school shall maintain accurate attendance records and communicate this information to parents and students who are sixteen years of age or older.
- 3. Should a student's attendance become identified as a continuing problem:
 - a) The Principal will communicate the concern in writing to the student and parents and explain attendance expectations that the student must achieve.
 - b) If the student continues not to meet the attendance expectations, a second letter will be sent to the parents indicating the seriousness of the problem and requesting a meeting.
 - c) The Principal will advise parents of the possible consequences such as:
 - Referred to the attendance board and/or
 - Recommendation for expulsion from the school
- 4. If the student fails to meet these conditions the Principal shall notify the Attendance Officer.
