

### **Background:**

On February 27<sup>th</sup> the Honorable Minister LaGrange, Minister of Education, provided school boards with a Budget for 2020. With this budget came a new funding and assurance model.



The new model encourages the following:

- More dollars in the classroom
- Increased flexibility in the model
- Allow school authorities to deliver best outcomes for students
- Reduce red tape and administrative costs
- Consolidated 36 grants into 15

### Some key highlights are:

- Student Funding Per student funding moved to a Weighted Moving Average (WMA)
  - o (3) Three years' worth of enrolment
    - **2018/19 20%**
    - **2019/20 30%**
    - 2020/21 projected 50%
- *High School Funding* uses the Weighted Moving Average (WMA) model and replaces Credit Enrolment Unit (CEU) and 10% higher than base rate.
- Rural Small Grants Eligible for schools with an enrolment threshold between 35 & 155 students
- **Specialized Learning Supports** for K-12 to meet the learning needs of students within an inclusive learning environment.
- PUF Funding
  - o funding for K students 1-12 funding
  - Pre-K PUF separate

- *Transportation* Same with an increase of 5%, new model to be developed.
- Operations and maintenance (targeted)
  - New formula using WMA
  - No dollars can be transferred out
- Board Administration targeted grant established for Board Governance and Administration, no transfers into this envelope.
- Community Grants
  - o Socioeconomic Status (SES) uses Statistics Canada 2016 factors
    - Mother's education, lone parent households, home ownership, average income and parents' post-secondary education.
  - Geographic looks at sparsity and distance
  - Nutrition SES index and WMA

### **Budgeting Principles**


Current budget principles are as follows:


- 1. The budget will be a balanced budget (may include restricted reserves).
- 2. Enveloped revenues will balance expenditures within the envelope.
- 3. The budget process is open and involves stakeholders.
- 4. The budget will address the goals identified in the Education Plan and the Priorities of Alberta education.
- 5. Resources will be allocated to provide equitable and fair opportunity for each student to receive a quality education program.
- 6. The budget is guided by principles of transparency and public accountability for the use of resources and the results achieved.
- 7. The budget will reflect appropriate reserves that ensure financial health and meet encumbrances.

The above principles have resulted in fiscal success in recent years as the Division has ended the five most recent fiscal years with reserves, thereby significantly improving the Divisions' financial health. Continuing with these principles will help the Division to maintain financial health in the future. As a result, to ensure sustainable initiatives, Golden Hills may choose to access accumulated operating reserves. Accessing these reserves will offset an operational deficit for the current budget year.

### **CAPITAL PLANNING**

### Background:

Alberta Education and Alberta Infrastructure require boards to submit annual capital planning priorities by April 1, 2020.

Capital planning considers the following needs: leases, modular classrooms, modernizations, new schools and replacement (new) schools. Alberta Education evaluates all requests according to factors such as utilization rates, facility condition, and enrolment patterns in order to establish the provincial priorities, which may receive funding approval.

The Board previously approved the following modular requests at the October 22, 2019 meeting:

School	Request
Strathmore High School	One New Modular classroom
Trinity Christian Academy (Strathmore)	Four New Modular classrooms
Prairie Christian Academy (Three Hills)	One New Modular classroom

Alberta Education recently notified Golden Hills that none of our requests were approved.

There are continuing challenges with the aging schools in South Kneehill County, with Greentree School in Drumheller and with Westmount School in Strathmore. These schools will require modernizing so they will be able to facilitate 21<sup>st</sup> Century learning opportunities.

### Recommendation:

That the Board of Trustees approves the request for continued support for the following:

- Conversion of existing Acme elementary sized gym to flex space and Career Technology Studies Area with the addition of a newly constructed, appropriately sized gym, with opportunity for potential community partnerships.
- 2. Westmount School (\$ 4,927,572 deferred maintenance)
- 3. Greentree School (\$ 3,131,111 deferred maintenance)

Alberta Education calculates funding for Kindergarten to Grade 9 based on the full-time equivalent student count as of September 30, 2019. High school funding is based on the Credit Enrolment Units earned per student.




