Since this meeting, the executive has been invited to meet with the Minister on topics of interest to rural Alberta School Boards.

Background:

The Board of Trustees regularly monitors enrolment and notes trends over time. Funding is primarily enrolment-driven and monitoring and projecting enrolment trends informs the board's budgeting processes.

As per the attached monitoring report, information is provided on September 30, 2016 enrolment of provincially funded students, Siksika funded students and International funded students.

Alberta Education calculates funding for Kindergarten to Grade 9 based on the full-time equivalent student count as of September 30, 2016. High school funding is based on the Credit Enrolment Units earned per student.

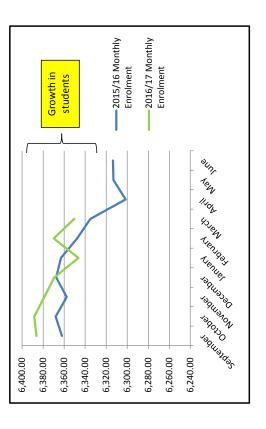

BUDGET ANNOUNCEMENT REPORTING

Background:

On March 16, 2017, Honorable Minister of Education, David Eggen announced 2017/2018 Budget.

A quick summary of the announcement is provided as follows:

- No changes in all the base grant rates.
- Small School By Necessity decrease (part due to consolidation of East Wheatland)
- Plant Operations and Maintenance Increase \$65,000
- Infrastructure Maintenance and Review (IMR) Increase \$286,000
- Carbon Levy \$150,000
- Regional Collaborative Service Delivery (RCSD) decrease \$79,000
- Credit Enrolment Unit (CEU) cap reduced from 60-45 per student still working out, but between \$600,000 - 800,000
- Bill 1 Resource fees Eliminated to Parents funding now received from Alberta Education \$300,000

Some of the key challenges are:

• Enrolment volatility – currently our straight-line projections and preliminary enrolment estimates show a decrease in students. Straight-line enrolment shows 407 students starting grade 1 and 493 graduating which is a difference of 86 students. Given the economic landscape in Alberta we have noticed lots of mobility and this will impact our enrolment numbers. Some of our schools have been experiencing a decline in students throughout the year on a larger scale than what we have seen in a while.

For the past three years we have anticipated straight-line projection declines, however we have experienced growth as a result of the various initiatives throughout the school division.

- *Collective Bargaining* implications are unknown at this time.
- Currently there are two areas that continue to operate in deficits Transportation and Plant Operations & Maintenance.
 - Carbon tax will negatively impact both these budgets.
 - o Reviewing all budgets for efficiencies and operational economies.

Priorities

- Align with Golden Hills Mission and Vision
- Program Continuity; &
- System Improvements

Where are we in the Process?

- Board established Budgeting Principles (February 21, 2017 Board Meeting #20170221.1006)
- Budget Development Stage Principals and Manager have projected enrolment and adjusted staffing levels and expenditures and are in the process of finalizing budgets.

BILL 1 BACKGROUNDER

"Inspiring confident, connected, caring citizens of the world"

April 25, 2017

Background:

On March 16, 2016, Minister Eggen announced a draft Bill 1 as follows:

• **Bill 1** – An Act to Reduce School Fees which has been tabled in the legislature. If passed it will be effective for the beginning of the school year 2017/2018

These fees include:

- Transportation for students who are attending their designated school and live more than 2.4km from the schools
- Instruction supplies or materials, such as textbooks, workbooks, printing and paper costs.
- Will also include: common fees charged to an entire student body or grade cohort for ex. Instructional fees, instructional materials, or basic fees.

	Timeline for Bill 1
April 2017	Table Discussions with Executive Groups
May 2017	Government review of the regulation process; boards begin to formulate policies and schedules based on information gather through table discussions
June 2017	Regulation in Force; Boards prepare their fee policies and schedule to submit to the Alberta Education
July 2017	Government reviews all policies
August 2017	Deadline for Board fee policies and Schedules to the public.

The Minister has indicated this is a phased approach and a second version is anticipated for 2018/2019 to further reduce certain "fee types". We do not have any further information and we will keep the board informed as to the progress of this legislation and any further developments.
